Collinsville, CT is known as one of the best preserved communities in New England. The village was built around a factory beginning in 1826, however with the factory currently closed, Collinsville houses a variety of antique stores, restaurants, arisans and small businesses. Over time, streetscape and infrastructure has slowly deteriorated, which is why Stadia was hired to assist in the survey and redesign of the streetscape.

The resulting plan has widened sidewalks in key locations, created a new public square for local festivals and gatherings, and incorporated the historic references of Collinsville through paving, walls and key placemaking elements. Other improvements include: bike racks, pedestrian scale lighting, increased parking, street trees, and information kiosk and wayfinding signage.
